## Walkathon Oct. 11, 2019

Please remember that Friday, Oct. 11th is the school Walkathon, our primary school fundraiser! Our fundraising goal this year is \$30,000. We appreciate efforts to raise more than the minimum amount and families who do so have the opportunity to receive incentives for their efforts. All students should come to school at the regular time. We will leave the school after morning prayer at 9:30. Parents who will be walking with a grade are asked to meet at the gym at 9:00 am. Walkathon is also an OUT-OF-UNIFORM day; please make sure your children have dressed appropriately for the weather. Keep in mind that students may get warm as they walk, jackets or sweatshirts that can be taken off and tied around the waist, or put in a small backpack are ideal. Students will receive a juice box and Rice Krispie snack to take with them on the walk.

Grades 1-7 will be dismissed at 12:00 from the school. Kindergarten students are dismissed at 11:30 from the Central Park playground. We need your full support to assist your children in collecting pledges from friends, family members, and co-workers. The proceeds from donations help us purchase furnaces for two classrooms, furniture for classrooms, library books, and sports equipment. It will also fund, partially or fully, special activities such as Hip Hop Dance Week, Gr.4 and Gr.7 Outdoor Education, and the Vancouver Opera performance of *Flight of the Hummingbird*. Thank you for all your efforts to make this year's Walkathon our best!

NOTE: Parents are to Check in with their child's teacher on the day of the walkathon to ensure they get credited for volunteer hours.

**You are not required to check-in at the office or on the iPad.**

Reminder: If you raise \$150 before the Walkathon you will receive a FREE Walkathon t-shirt. Please contact your teacher or the office to let us know your child's name, class and shirt size. Other prizes to be won include:

Donor Prizes: Draw for a \$200 Visa Prepaid gift card. Online donors who give \$20 or more will be entered into a prize draw for a \$200 Visa Prepaid gift card and receive a tax receipt. For every \$50 by an individual donated online through Chimp Donor page a ballot will be entered into a draw for a \$450 Best Buy gift card.

Highest Dollar amount raised: The highest dollar amount raised by a single family will receive a \$175 gift card to Best Buy. Second highest family will receive \$100 Cineplex gift card and third highest family will receive a \$50 gift card.

Individual Student Prizes: Cineplex Child Adventure Movie & Concession package will go to the top 3 student earners in each class.

Class Prizes: The Primary and Intermediate class with the highest percentage of their fundraising goal met will get one out of uniform day, a free field trip and a free lunch. The primary and intermediate class in second place will receive one out-of-uniform day and a treat.
